Little Organ Book) BWV 599–644 is a set of 46 chorale preludes for organ one of them is given in two versions — by Johann Sebastian Bach.

David Butterworth offers members the chance to investigate this set of pieces together at his home in Halam with its own pipe organ, playing a selection of preludes, looking at interpretation, registration, tips on fingering and pedalling, ornamentation. The event is sure to be a hit with organists and organ music fans alike. This event is due to be our first live event following the Covid 19 pandemic and we do encourage you to attend.

10:30am - St Barnabas Catholic Cathedral, Derby Road, Nottingham.

Greg Treloar (Director of Music) will give a talk on "The Challenges and hopes for Catholic Church music in Nottingham and the UK". Members will then be able to play the cathedral organ, which is a 3 manual organ built by Norman & Beard in 1913, and worked on by Willis in 1980, Hill Norman and Beard in 1989 and Henry Groves in 1995. The organ has 44 stops.
